






ANTI-BULLYING WEEK & FRIENDSHIP FRIDAY

PHENOMENAL PHONICS!

Earlier this month we were very pleased to receive letter from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP who is the Minister of State for School Standards!

We would like to thank everyone involved including the families and the staff for achieving such a fantastic result for the Year 1 pupils in 2018-19. Our results from previous years were also very strong:

Year 1 Phonics 2016-17 = 94% Year 1 Phonics 2017-18 = 93%

Alongside this success we have always been very proud of the way staff and families have worked together to nurture a love of reading in all children.

Dear Mr Custance,

I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on your school's outstanding achievements in the 2019 phonics screening check. Your excellent teaching of phonics is something I hope to see replicated across the country: decoding skills are the foundations for pupils to progress to reading fluently, for purpose and for enjoyment.

There is a substantial body of evidence that demonstrates that systematic phonics is a highly effective method for teaching children to read. We want to ensure that every child develops a firm grasp of phonics, which is why I was delighted to see your results. With 100 per cent of pupils at Floreat Wandsworth Primary School reaching or exceeding the pass mark in the check, your school is in the top two per cent of all primary schools in the country.

This year's figures show that 88 per cent of pupils who achieve the expected standard in the check go on to achieve at least the expected standard in key stage 1 reading teacher assessment, which underlines the importance of teaching pupils to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation in literacy, from which they can develop excellent vocabulary and cultivate a love of reading that can last a lifetime.

Thank you for your commitment and success in teaching the next generation to read so effectively.

- Please note that the school does not accept any responsibility for any watches or jewellery that are lost.






ATTENDANCE

- We aim to make every moment in school count. The school year of 183 days is carefully designed to ensure pupils receive lots of opportunities for family time alongside purposeful learning at school. Please support us by ensuring your child is in school, and on time, each day.

OUR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2019-20

- The School Leadership Team and teachers will ensure pupils close any achievement gaps for the expected standard in the core subjects of Reading, Writing & Maths. Pupils who are exceeding national expectations in these subjects will continue to tackle motivating and challenging activities in the classroom.
- The School Leadership Team will continue to support pupils in preparing them for Secondary School education.
- The School Leadership Team will work closely with GLF (our new Trust) and the services they provide to ensure the staff and the pupils are fulfilling their potential e.g. the school will engage in new GLF systems to improve the way leaders and teachers are held to account.
- The whole team will ensure the wider curriculum is embedded to meet the needs of all pupils. Wider curriculum subjects include Drama, Music, Mindfulness, Computing and many more. We have now split our teachers and leaders into Faculties (Core, Knowledge & Character) so that Faculty members can work together to improve standards across the whole school.
