- Homework can now be handed in on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday (parental choice). We advise, where possible, for pupils to complete the majority of their homework over the weekend. This will ensure that they are in a routine ready for both weekend and weekday homework as they progress through the school.
- Thank you to all our families for helping to make the start and end to our day so calm and purposeful. After some feedback we have made changes to the Year 2 & 3 dismissal routine – we think that this has already had a positive impact on the pupils and their respective families. We are also working as a team to ensure the Reception pupils enter the school as quickly as possible in the morning – thank you for your patience!
- Year 3 Blazers we are working with Stevensons to get a better fit for our pupils.
- Planning Ahead We have high aspirations for all of our pupils. We strongly believe that our nurturing and academic approach will ensure they are all very well prepared for the challenges ahead. QUICK MESSAGES

- Swimming Lessons for Year 3 Pupils will start in the Spring Term.
- We are a nut free school: Please ensure that packed lunches and after school snacks remain nut free. We have pupils with severe nut allergies and are at risk if they accidently come into contact with nuts.
- Healthy Snacks & Year 3 Packed Lunches: All snacks and packed lunches (Year 3 only) must be healthy. Crisps, sweets and chocolate are not permitted in this school.
- Clubs Collection: Persistently late collections will result in your child forfeiting their place on a club. Club providers are contracted until 4.45pm only.
- Behaviour during clubs: We expect pupils to have a fantastic time during all club sessions. Any behaviour which disturbs the learning and en joyment of others may result in a child having to forfeit their club place.
- Lateness: Any children arriving late in the morning will need to enter through the office.

| Vandsworth 10-10 Badge | Available to all pupils. These are usually awarded to pupils in Reception although some Nursery pupils may achieve this by the end of the academic year. | IO-IO Badge Pupils must be able to demonstrate rapid recall of any number bond from I to IO. Teachers can award these badges at any time. They will ask the child a series of number bond questions e.g. Can you tell me different ways of making 8? Can you tell me different ways of making 5? |
| Eloreat Wandsworth 20-20 Badge | Available to all pupils. These are usually awarded to pupils in Year I although some Reception pupils may achieve this by the end of the academic year. | 20-20 Badge Pupils must be able to demonstrate rapid recall of any number bond from I to 20. Teachers can award these badges at any time. They will ask the child a series of number bond questions e.g. Can you tell me different ways of making 9? Can you tell me different ways of making 17? |
| 2-5-10 Badge | Available to all pupils. These are usually awarded to pupils in Year 2 although some Year I pupils may achieve this by the end of the academic year. | 2-5-10 Badge Pupils must be able to demonstrate rapid recall of any times table question involving the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Teachers can award these badges at any time. They will ask the child a series of times table questions. $2 \times 4? 4 \times 2? 5 \times 5? 10 \times 2? 8 \times 2? 12 \times 10? 9 \times 5?$ |
| | Available to all pupils. These are usually awarded to pupils in Year 4 although some Year 3 pupils may achieve this by the end of the academic year. | I44 Badge Pupils must know all of their time tables from the I to I2 . Pupils will be invited to take part in a timed, written challenge. 20 questions will be asked in a random sequence e.g. 2 x 7, 9 x I2, I0 x 5, I2 x I2, 6 x 8 |

| Head Girl | Available to all pupils in Years I, 2 & 3. | Head Cirls & Boys For pupils who are exemplary role models to others. These badges are awarded to one girl and one boy from each year group in Years I, 2 and 3. The post is held for a full term or half a term. |

| | Available to all pupils. | The Golden Chair Pupils who display exceptional service to others will be granted the privilege of sitting on the Golden Chair during the weekly assembly. |
| | Available to all pupils. | Certificate of 100% Attendance These certificates are awarded at the mid and end points of the academic year. Pupils must be in school every day and on time to be awarded this certificate. |
| CHARTER OF THE RECEIPTION OF T | Available to all pupils. | Certificate of Excellence These certificates are awarded on a weekly basis to one child per class for an outstanding piece of work or contribution to school life e.g. being kind to others. |
