## Phase 1 flower garden wishlist

We would like to plant easy-care shrubs, climbers, bedding and bulbs to give us lovely all year round colour. We'd love to have lots of flowers that are good for pollinators which means natural types with simpler flowers are better than highly bred plants with lots of petals that make it hard for bees to get in. ## Autumn 2016

- Flowers to spruce up our rainbow flower bed, to flower over autumn/winter:
  - a. Pansies preferably red, yellow, orange or blue/purple
  - b. Cyclamen plants preferably red or pink
  - c. Primulas in bright colours of the rainbow
  - d. Snapdragons in bright colours of the rainbow
- More sedums for the top of the bug hotel
- Herbs especially parsley, mint, chives, tarragon
- Wallflowers
- Michaelmas daisies in blue/purple (not too big please)
- Lavender any kind

### Spring 2017

- Hardy fuschia collection they look like little ballet dancers
- Australian Tree Fern for our dinosaur corner
- Other hardy ferns for our dinosaur corner
- More climbers for the roadside to flower across the year eg passionflower, trachelospermum jasminoides (evergreen and flowers like jasmine)
- Summer flowering plants preferably pollinator friendly and in bright cheery colours
- Sunflower seeds various colours
- Sweet pea seeds any colour of the rainbow
- Cress seeds for gardening club

## Bulbs wishlist – any colour of the rainbow!

Whatever you fancy but we would especially love:

- Daffodils (including extras for pupils to plant in pots)
- Tulips (especially in red and orange)
- English bluebells (not the Spanish ones which are invasive)
- Scylla (lovely blue colour)
- Crocus
- Snowdrops
- Cyclamen hederifolium

## Phase 2 kitchen garden - once site is ready (over winter we hope)

- Apple trees (talk to us about which we need to choose the right combination so they cross-fertilise)
- Other fruit trees eg pear/plum? (talk to us about which we need to have at least two of each kind that flower at the same time to get fruit)
- Blueberry bushes
- Autumn fruiting raspberries
- Wild strawberries
- Other fruit bushes preferably not prickly
- Other annual fruit and veg plants eg lettuce, broccoli, cherry tomatoes, etc. we are open minded
- seeds suitable for outdoor kitchen garden eg
  - a. peas
  - b. climbing runner and other beans various colours
  - c. dwarf French beans various colours
  - d. carrots (preferably carrot fly resistant varieties
  - e. lettuce various shapes/colours
  - f. radishes
  - g. herbs eg basil

- h. outdoor cucumbers
- i. beetroot various colours
- j. swiss chard various colours
- k. sweetcorn
- I. pumpkin
- m. kale?
- n. Onion sets
- o. Mushrooms to grow in a box
- [we don't need potatoes we have free ones coming from "potatoes for schools"
- [if we reach RHS award level 3 we will get three free boxes of fruit and veg plug plants]
- Pea sticks
