As the end of the year arrives, we will be bidding a fond farewell to our Year 6 pupils - some of whom have been with us since 2015 when our journey as a new school began! A special mention must go to Arthur and Daniel from Year 6 who finished with an average attendance of 99.7% across 7 full years at Floreat Wandsworth. This is an incredible achievement and you have set the bar very high for future year groups!

The Year 6 pupils have had a production, assembly and a little treat all within a week (see page 6 for the photos). It was a very emotional experience for both parents and staff to watch their final assembly and we wish all of the Year 6 children the very best for Year 7 and beyond. We can now look back and reflect on what has been a wonderful year with so much to celebrate and a few highlights have been listed below...

- We returned to a full routine of on-site education, community events, trips, Sports Days and Family Learning sessions. The levels of parent attendance and participation has been very high throughout the year - thank you!
- We received some fantastic academic test results including 91% in Year 1 phonics, 90% in Year 2 Maths, 81% in the Year 6 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling test and 36% of Year 6 pupils achieved 'greater depth' in Reading (all of these results were well above the national average)
- We were awarded the School of Character Kitemark after 7 years of hard work! The full report has been shared with parents.
- We had the privilege of being invited to Westminster to collect our Tooting Heroes Award this award was for everyone involved in the school (see the photo below)!

We would also like to say a big thank you to all of our amazing staff - visitors often comment about the calm and positive atmosphere we have created and this is down to you! We are, however, saying a fond farewell to the following staff who are off on new adventures: Ms McCollin, Ms Ford, Ms Brown (Y6), Ms Rowe, Ms Richardson, Ms Marfo, Ms Kinnah-Brown and Ms Temeng. Thank you for all of your dedication, support and positivity - we will miss you!

We are also saying goodbye to Ms Burke who has been appointed the Head of School role at Kilnwood Vale Primary (a GLF School) in September. Ms Burke has been instrumental in raising standards across the school since she joined us in 2017. Congratulations to Ms Burke and good luck! Your smile and boundless energy will be sorely missed.




### YEAR 1 SCIENCE MUSEUM TRIP
