Dear Parents,

Thank you for your endless support this term. Your commitment to social distancing, wearing face masks and adhering to the drop off and collection times has made a huge difference and we all very much appreciate your willingness to adapt and work positively with the school. Our school/parent partnership is as strong as ever and we must also thank everyone involved with FOFW (our PTA) who continue to fundraise and provide opportunities for the pupils despite the current challenges (the panto was great fun!).

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all the responses to our **Parent Survey**. You can find the results attached to the email dated 18.12.20. We were delighted to see that 100% of responses either agree or strongly agree that we ensure parents receive the information they need about the learning that goes on in the classroom. We are also very pleased that 93% agree or strongly agree that the school has a clear vision. This statistic is backed by 93% who strongly agree or agree that the school has high expectations for all pupils. We are very proud of these results as it reflects the hard work completed by the entire school community.

Thank you also to the parents who took the time to give us written feedback in detail. This feedback has been shared with the teachers and with the Governing Body. We recognise that there is further work to do on our wider curriculum and also ensuring that all pupils are set appropriate challenges within the classroom next term - this is something that Mrs Marsden (Head of Inclusion) has been working on with the teaching teams and will be our focus for the rest of the academic year.

As we turn our attention to the Spring Term we must act on our knowledge of the pupils and ensure they are given the learning opportunities they need to reach their individual goals - this includes targets for core skills, knowledge and character. As a school we know that we must focus on ensuring that our core skills work (English and Maths) has an even greater impact on the wider curriculum subjects such as Geography and RE. We are delighted with the progress we have made but we will not stop until the standard of work is the best that it can be and we look forward to sharing the books with you.

The standard of behaviour in this school remains at a consistently high level. The leadership team meet regularly to ensure we have a relentless focus on ensuring pupils care for one another and are mindful of their actions and words. We will also ensure that all staff, parents and pupils receive the information they need to understand what bullying is and how it is immediately addressed at Floreat Wandsworth.

Finally, we would like to say a huge well done to all the pupils for their festive performances - they were an absolute triumph from start to finish! These performances showcased the emphasis we place on pupils having a confident voice and establishing an inclusive environment for all children. Keats Class - Year 3

In music, pupils have been practising their harmonies for the Christmas show.






Ennis Class - Year 3

Ennis Class have been learning about the life cycle of a plant. Here are some students representing a deciduous plant's life cycle from seed to full growth.






Yousafzai Class - Year 4

Keller Class - Year 1


Year 1 have been exploring the work of Joan Miro. We had so much fun painting a huge picture as a team inspired by his work 'Ciphers and Constellations'.






Edison Class - Year 2






Simonds Class -


The pupils in Simmonds




Farah Class - Year 4

In English, Farah have been learning to write a comparative text. We have made up our own cities to compare and contrast using what we have learnt this half term.


In Science, we have been learning all about classification of animals and plants. The children were challenged at the end of the topic to write everything they know about the different classes of animals and plants.
