OUR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

This year (2021-22) we will be focusing on the following:

- There will be a particular focus on Reading & Writing and ensuring all pupils reach their personal best outcomes. All teachers will provide motivating and challenging activities in the classroom to help achieve this goal.
- The whole team will ensure the wider curriculum is embedded to meet the needs of all pupils. Wider curriculum subjects include Character, Music, Science, Computing and many more (see the box below).
- Established reading, writing and mathematical skills will be evidenced within wider curriculum subjects such as Geography and History.
- The return of a full programme of community events including Family Learning, PTA Fairs and School Concerts.

WORKING TOGETHER

At this school we always work together to ensure our pupils are happy and safe. We also work together to ensure families have a voice so their concerns, views and opinions are heard.

In the first instance you can always approach the **Headteacher** (Mr Custance) about any concern or question you may have. Mr Custance will then offer advice and support or he will guide you to the right person for the appropriate advice and support.

You can also raise concerns, views and opinions using the following process:

STEP 1: We always attempt to resolve any issues or concerns at classroom level first. Our class teachers are always ready to help.

STEP 2: If Step 1 is not successful then you can request to meet one of the Leaders (either be one of the Key Stage Leaders or one of the Assistant Headteachers).

STEP 3: On the very rare occasion that Steps 1 & 2 do not bring a satisfactory conclusion to the issue then a request can be made to meet with Mr Custance (Headteacher).

This week we have been learning about the artist Alma Woodsey Thomas. We have enjoyed painting our own pictures in the style of her famous art work 'The Eclipse'. During choosing time, we have been exploring technology by using the iPads to take photographs.






To mark Black History Month, the children learnt about the extraordinary life of Rosa Parks, and used this information to create a detailed biography about her. The writing demonstrated that it won't be long until some pen licenses will be awarded in Year 5 (photos above left & middle)! In RE, Year 5 have been studying Sikhism. They acted out the story of why Sikhs celebrate Vaisakhi, owing to Guru Gobind Singh's forming of the Khalsa during the harvest festival of Vaisakhi in 1699 (photo above right).

YEAR 2



Year 2 have been learning about odd and even numbers in Maths and towards the end of the week, they learned to find the difference between numbers. We have explored these concepts with concrete resources and had so much fun! We decided to showcase some of the learning from Black History Month in the Year 2 corridor. Here is a snapshot of part of our corridor, which consists of posters that the children made about Rosa Parks.

YEAR 6



Year 6 have been learning all about life on the Home Front during World War One. They created fabulous double page spreads to present their information. They have also been recreating Leonardo da Vinci's anatomical drawings in Art (see the front page!).

YEAR 3




For Black History Month, we have been researching historical figures, such as Barack Obama and Mary Seacole, and learning about their lives. In Science, we conducted an experiment using teacakes and paper straws to see how the skeletal system works to protect our organs! In Computing, we used the new school laptops to research different topics, including capital cities and heads of state.

YEAR 4



Year 4 explored the concept of teamwork and are passing the high five in the above left photo - with each try we explored how to improve passing the five around the circle. In the middle photo, a pupil is explaining what 'rights' are by exploring Emmeline Pankhurst and the rights of women and men. We also explored how unfair treatment was finally noticed for children and women. In the above right photo, a pupil is explaining what democracy is to the children, while focusing on the UN and children's rights. Each time we discussed why children have rights and responsibilities.

In Year 1 we have been doing some fantastic learning that has inspired some brilliant work, from instruction writing to Black History Month home learning to Van Gogh style paintings!
