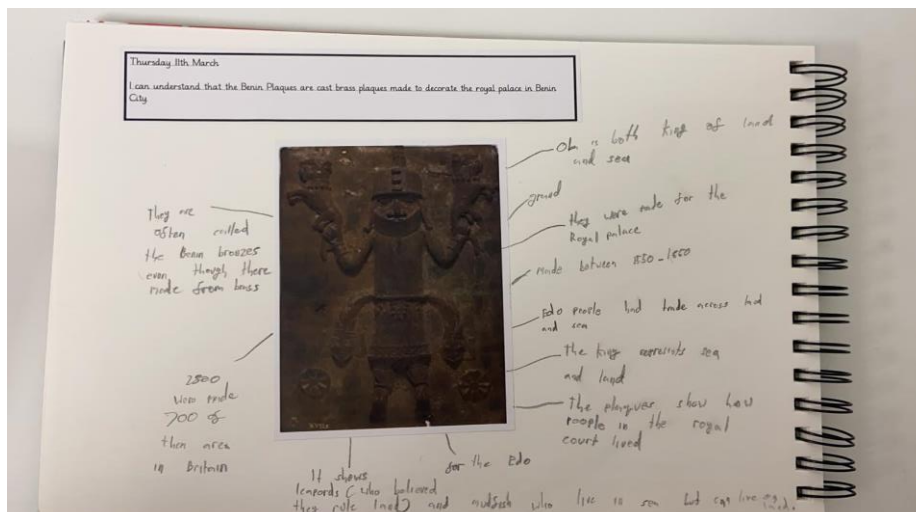
Reception

Here is a photo of a group of children exploring capacity using the idea of 'watering the flower pots'.

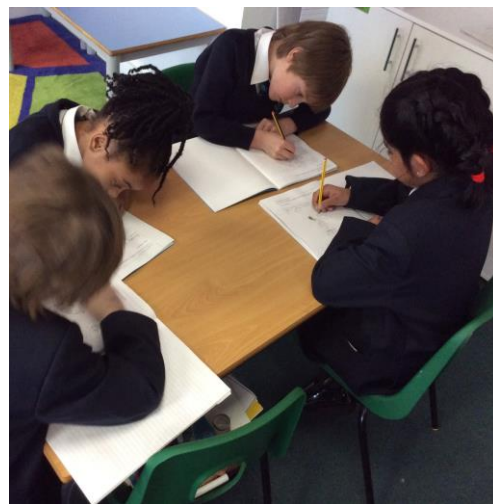

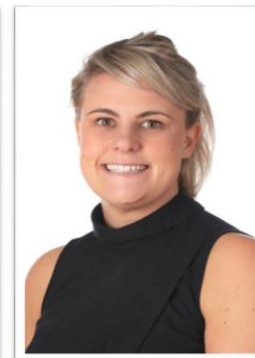
