



FLOREAT WANDSWORTH SPORTS PREMIUM REPORT 2020/21

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The Sports Premium Grant is additional funding from the Government to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. It is also for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.

How much is the Sports Premium Grant?

Allocations are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6

Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil.

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

For Floreat Wandsworth Primary School, this amounts to **£18,160** for 2020-21.

We are using this allocation to achieve a number of sustainable objectives:

1. To develop and enhance the teaching of high-quality PE across the curriculum in all classes.
2. To develop the leadership of PE to enable sustainable quality provision.
3. To provide opportunities for physical activity due to the restrictions of our site.
4. To increase our resources/equipment for the delivery of P.E.

What is the Impact of the Sports Premium Grant?

2018 is the second year that Floreat Wandsworth will receive Sports Premium Grant.

We anticipate that Sports Premium Grant will lead to:

- Increased opportunities for all of our pupils to access a wider variety of PE and Sports
- Opportunities to develop the skills of sportsmanship
- Develop pupil understanding of the importance of keeping fit and healthy, as well as, ways that they can improve their health and fitness.
- Pupils who are fitter, healthier and are motivated to continue to improve.

The use of the Sports Premium Grant is monitored and reviewed by Governors annually.

<p>Extra coach provided for all PE lessons on top of existing provision.</p> <p>Extended Sports Provision for KS1 & KS2 including sports events and fixtures</p>	£10,000	<p>An extra professional coach will enable all classes to be split into two smaller groups where coaches can explicitly model new skills and focus on particular pupils who need extra support or encouragement.</p> <p>Professional coaches to support pupils and nurture a love of competitive sport through team training sessions and fixtures against other schools.</p> <p>There will be opportunities for staff to teach and learn alongside professionals as well as planned observations.</p>	<p><i>Monitoring:</i> Staff will be required regular observations as part of their performance management. SSB to monitor and report back.</p> <p><i>Sustainability:</i> Designated members of staff will be able to teach across the Key Stages and thus have an impact on future outcomes for all pupils. Older pupils gain experience in being an out of school role model in extracurricular subjects. SSB to monitor and report back.</p> <p><i>Impact:</i> Children develop their teamwork skills, self-esteem, core body strength, flexibility, coordination and cognitive functioning.</p> <p>2020/21 IMPACT – All pupils in the school engaged in PE within smaller groups and all pupils made ‘good+’ progress. When the school was closed pupils had access to remote PE videos tailored to their age range.</p> <p>No PE lessons will be cancelled due to the impact of the weather and the coaches will be able to split into two small groups in the hall.</p> <p>Pupils were all able to engage in PE within small groups. PE coaches were then able to support and challenge pupils as required.</p>
<p>Physical Equipment for the playground</p>	£4000	<p>The school has identified a small minority of pupils as ‘non-participants’ in lunchtime and after-school sports activities.</p> <p>We have identified play equipment which will promote physical development as well as encouraging their self-esteem. All children will have access to this equipment during the allocated break times throughout the year.</p>	<p><i>Monitoring:</i> Staff will be trained by the SLT in how to promote fun and enjoyable physical play using the equipment.</p> <p><i>Sustainability:</i> All children will have access to this equipment throughout this academic year and beyond.</p> <p><i>Impact:</i> Children develop their self-esteem, hand-eye coordination, teamwork skills, core body strength and cognitive functioning.</p> <p>2020/21 IMPACT – Pupils have been able to engage with high quality sports equipment both during their break times. Dodgeball has been a particular success as indicated during a Pupil Voice session. Associate Staff target individuals and groups of pupils to engage in structured activities promoting positive self-esteem and physical activity. Strategic leadership has a positive impact on the playground set-up and use of Associate Staff. The needs of the pupils are met alongside wider support strategies e.g. ELSA.</p>
<p>PE Equipment for PE sessions throughout the year with all ages.</p>	£4160	<p>The school has identified sports equipment that will enhance the teaching and learning of PE within the school. .</p> <p>We have identified sports equipment which will promote physical development, teamwork and self-esteem. All children will have access to this equipment during the allocated PE sessions throughout the year.</p>	<p><i>Impact:</i> Children develop their self-esteem, teamwork skills, hand-eye coordination, core body strength and cognitive functioning.</p> <p><i>Monitoring:</i> Staff will be trained by the SLT in how to promote fun and enjoyable PE sessions using the equipment.</p> <p><i>Sustainability:</i> All children will have access to this equipment throughout this academic year and beyond.</p> <p>2020/21 IMPACT – Pupils have been able to engage with high quality sports equipment both during the PE lessons and after school clubs. Pupil Voice has been captured which gives leaders a clear indication that pupils enjoy using the equipment and that it has a positive impact on their learning.</p>

£3,700 will be allocated to the 2021-22 Sports Premium allocation. This is from an underspend during the 2020-21 academic year.
